My daughter, Amy, loved the children's show Dinosaur Train when she was younger. Have you seen it? It's brilliant. It has a train system run by talking dinosaurs that can time travel through the entire Mesozoic Era, passing through a magical time tunnel to the Triassic, Jurassic, and Cretaceous time periods. What's not to love? We loved it so much that when the Boris the Tyrannosaurus 24" interactive talking figure came out on Black Friday in 2010, we *had* to have it! We waited in line outside of Toys-R-Us in the cold night hoping for a chance to grab one before they sold out.

Our foster daughter at that time was an older teenager and had gone with me. Once we were inside she spotted the display before I did and pulled an acrobatic maneuver around other shoppers and displays to grab one of the large boxes holding the prized dino. I remember her holding it up in the air like a trophy. We had gotten a Boris for Amy for Christmas! We were triumphant! We still laugh about the adventure today. I still have Boris. Then in 2011 a book came out by Mike Slaughter called: Christmas Is Not Your Birthday: Experience the Joy of Living and Giving like Jesus. Well, the title says it all, and Slaughter goes further to teach that overspending, overeating, materialism, and busyness rob us of our peace and joy and rob Jesus of his rightful role as the center of our celebration. Bah-humbug! I found these headlines, and the sentiment that goes with them, offensive and heartbreaking. Christmas will happen regardless of the supply chain of toys and jewelry and what-not that you are told make Christmas special. The birth of Jesus Christ will be remembered, celebrated, and we will lift up His name as our Savior and our God. Nothing on earth has the power to cancel or ruin that.





TIPS FOR CELEBRATING A SUSTAINABLE HOLIDAY SEASON

- Ditch the wrapping paper for reusable boxes and bags. Use the same boxes and bags to store your decorations in the off-season. Use your fabric stash or tea towels for wrapping. If you're going to use wrapping paper, stay away from those with coatings, foil and glitter, as they cannot be recycled.
- Consider not buying new holiday decorations this year and instead take advantage of the excellent antique and second-hand shops in the area to add to your collections.
- Participating in a Secret Santa with friends or coworkers? Encourage a switch to Alternative
 Gifts like donations to favorite charities. It's a great way to keep things out of landfills AND
 offers a chance to get to know people a little better when you ask them why that charity is
 meaningful to them. (We have lots of options with the MUMC ADVENTure in Mission
 Alternative Gift program!)
- **Send electronic Christmas cards instead of paper ones.** If you send paper cards, choose ones made from recycled paper and stay away from those with glitter, foil and special coatings so they can be easily recycled. Save your Christmas cards to use for gift tags and for other crafts in the future.
- Using a live tree? **Cut it up to use for mulch for your garden in coming seasons**. If you have an artificial tree, **use it for as long as you possibly can**.
- Time to replace holiday lights? Don't throw away old lights! They can be recycled through special programs, and we'll help! Starting December 1, bring your broken and unusable strings of Christmas lights to the church and EarthAware will ship them to a recycler.
- Make the switch to LED lights. They cost a little more upfront, but they last longer and save energy. Be sure to turn off all lights before you go to bed to save energy.
