Program Overview



Youth Group 😭

Junior and senior high youth (6th-12th grade) are invited to gather in the youth room on the first Sunday of each month at 10AM before worship at 11AM. Youth Group gatherings are relaxed, safe spaces for youth to engage in wonder-and-meaning-filled friendship and conversation. Come as you are and be yourself. Each session will present a new theme or topic with a short video or other form of media and scripture reading, followed by group discussion and/or interactive activities.

Whenever possible, middle and high school students will be broken out into separate groups for age-appropriate discussion. Topics will be selected in response to youth-expressed desires and concerns, or are relevant to the flow of both the academic and liturgical year. Following, all are highly encouraged to attend worship, sitting with family or as a group with leader(s).

Confirmation - "Big God, Big Questions"



Confirmation meetings will take place on the second Sunday of each month between September and May. This nine-month journey is for youth entering 7th grade and above. No confirmand journeys alone. Both Pastors Jessie MacMillan and Lindsay Harren-Lewis, and Director of Youth + Adult Faith Formation Kate McFadden, are all available for prayer and support. Additionally, each confirmand works closely with two key persons: an adult and peer mentor (10th-12th Grade). In the spring, both youth and mentors will write about their unique faith in their own words.

"Confirmation is not meant to be a crash course in Christianity, but an opportunity to welcome youth i<mark>nto an intentional time of</mark> discernment and conversations about faith, exploring the BIG Questions so that the confirmands can make a faithful response." -Big God, Big Questions: Confirmation for a Growing Faith PC(USA)

The word confirm, from the Latin confirmare, means "to strengthen." At Confirmation, the Spirit and the church's prayers strengthen those who are being confirmed. This strenthening includes preparing youth who were baptized as babies to share their faith and intent to take part in the life of the church. For those not baptized, Confirmation would include both Baptism and a profession of faith. For youth who complete the Confirmation journey, but choose not to be confirmed, the Fairmount faith community will offer a blessing and affirmation of unconditional love and support.

Food Not Bombs



This is a new community partnership for FPC youth programs inspired by the spirit and ethos of the Little Free Pantry. Food Not Bombs (FNB) is a volunteer run, grassroots, mutual aid organization that shares free food worldwide. FNB gives away fresh produce and bread on a grassy lot at 6321 St Clair Ave., in Cleveland every Sunday, Once per month, FPC youth will work as a team to help carry out the food share from 2:00 to 4:30PM. A brief 30-minute Zoom orientation prior to volunteering is required. We will work outdoors in the elements, so dress appropriately for the weather.

The name "Food Not Bombs" comes from the belief that food is a human right and poverty is a form of violence. Their team of volunteers serve people year-round in all weather conditions. No ID, proof of residence, citizenship, family size or income is required to receive food. Everybody eats.
