

HYMN 305

Come Sing, O Church, in Joy! This text was the winner in a hymn competition sponsored by the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Bicentennial Committee for the 1988–1989 observance, which had the theme "Celebrate the Journey." The late 18th-century tune (first used with Psalm 148) is appropriately celebratory.

HYMN 770

The image of a great feast showing God's welcome of all people was part of Jewish tradition (Isaiah 25:6–9) and underlies Jesus' parable of the Great Banquet (Luke 14:15–24). Such equality remains as unknown to many people today as it was to the slaves who created this spiritual.

HYMN 772

This text on Luke 4:16–20, the author's first, was written for the United Presbyterian Women's National Meeting in July 1976 because the team planning worship could not find a suitable hymn on that passage. She wrote the words with this vigorous 18th-century tune in mind.

Stewardship Update

Fairmount Family, your generosity is wonderful and a clear testament to the strength and fellowship at this church! Thank you for all the ways you give. As we head into September, we are planning for the 2022 Stewardship campaign, but it is not too late to pledge and give for 2021. Fairmount Welcomes Nationally Renowned Poet-Professor Dr. Joshua Bennett Sunday, October 3rd, at 4:00pm

Fairmount Presbyterian Church, as part of the William Birkett Williams Memorial Lecture series, presents Dr. Joshua Bennett, Professor of English and Creative Writing at Dartmouth College. Dr. Joshua Bennett is the author of four books of poetry and criticism: The Sobbing School (Penguin, 2016)—winner of the National Poetry Series and a finalist for an NAACP Image Award—as well as Being Property Once Myself (Harvard University Press, 2020), Owed (Penguin, 2020), and The Study of Human Life



(Penguin, 2022). Earlier this year, Joshua received a Guggenheim Fellowship and a Whiting Award for Poetry and Nonfiction. He lives in Massachusetts with his wife and son, Pam and August, and their family dog, Apollo 5.
