At CEIRS you will encounter outstanding local teachers and professors, as well as nationally known speakers, who teach on a myriad of topics: Biblical Studies, Spirituality, Ethics, Comparative Religions, and Theology and Culture.

Fairmount Presbyterian Church is one of the CEIRS church partners across the Greater Cleveland area, providing support and making it possible to keep the cost of CEIRS courses affordable.

Living well through all the phases of our life is of utmost importance. Yet our culture does all of us a great disservice by emphasizing youthfulness at the cost of the aged, and completely avoids anything dealing with the death of the body. Only when we embrace the fullness of life can we fully live through each part of our earthly journey. We will be focusing on pragmatic and spiritual issues regarding preparing for the end of life. Materials will be provided for starting the conversation in your family and preparing a Durable Power of Attorney for Healthcare.

Rev. Stephen C. Blonder Adams is a Spiritual Care Coordinator with Hospice of the Western Reserve. He first came to Cleveland from seminary in 1989 as Interim Associate Pastor for the Old Stone Church, and has since served OS as a Parish Associate, Wedding Officiant, and Gap Pastor. He has served as Interim Pastor for three other churches in the Cleveland area, and Gap Pastor for Lyndhurst Presbyterian. He has been a guest lecturer at CWRU, CCF and UH, having spoken nationally and internationally on such topics as Spirituality & Medicine, Healing Touch and Cultural Diversity. He is also an artist and trained vocalist, annually singing at Park Synagogue for the High Holy Days Choir. Pastor Stephen and his husband, Bruce, have been together 28 years, residing in Cleveland Heights, and are grateful for marriage equality.

September Session Highlights

Care Council: worked hard on producing Celebrate Sunday, the joyous fellowship event enjoyed by members and friends. Several people have expressed interest in becoming Stephen's Ministers, but so far, no Stephen's Leaders have stepped up. The proposed Guess Who's Calling program will be folded into Flock Tenders.

Admin Council: Recently, an electric panel in the Sanctuary malfunctioned, and once turned on, there were sparks. The Admin Council voted to keep it off until it could be checked by professionals. These are the Sanctuary lights near the front. The side lawn work has been completed. The sprinkler system is in. Vicky Mentrek has worked hard on the landscaping. The mid-year financials through June 30th are complete. The Operating Budget is about break-even—which is good. We have about 75% of pledges fulfilled to date, but still short on pledges as a whole. The Treasurer is actively working to get the second PPP loan forgiven. Financially, the church is currently strong. The endowment is performing very well. Pledging is particularly important this year as we search for a new pastor.

Serve Council: The Breaking New Ground Campaign Committee is up and running. We are encouraging everyone on Session and Serve to participate by donating to the matching gift campaign. A possible 2022 youth trip to Batey 105 in the Dominican Republic is being explored, with a back-up plan.

Faith Formation

Session's responsibility for worship was discussed. Things are much more complicated now with the hybrid services, and more help from the congregation is needed. The church may benefit from having a committee to oversee worship and music. Discussion to be continued.

PNC Update

In the time since our last report, your Pastor Nominating Committee has been hard at work. We have:

- Received final approval from the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry of the "Ministry Information Form," which is a document that is read by prospective candidates to tell them who Fairmount is
- Established a process for reviewing prospective candidates' Personal Information Forms
- Held in-depth conversations around the criteria that we will use to guide our process
- Reviewed the Personal Information Forms of over 50 candidates

The PNC is thankful for your continued prayers as we continue our search.

Youth Faith Formation

Fall Youth Faith Formation programming is off to a great start! We kicked off September with fun freebies and program information on Celebrate Sunday, followed by a social event: bowling and pizza at Pinstripes. This year's confirmation class has completed orientation and we are excited for nine confirmands between 7th and 9th grade who will journey through the "Big God, Big Questions" process through June 2022. New this year: youth in 10th through 12th grade will serve as Confirmation Peer Mentors.
