It's here!!! Carmel's new and greatly improved website! See what it's all about at <u>www.presbycarmel.org</u> There are lots of photos, including church events, Carmel's stained glass windows, Carmel groups for all ages, our mission and community outreach, and much more. You can click on links for the current livestream worship, past services, the daily lectionary, or to send a prayer request or make a financial donation.

Carmel's project team leaders Janet Simon and Kim Williams, along with fellow project team members Ken Schuyler and Rev. Peter Sulyok, have been hard at work with our website provider Worship Times since January, 2021, on this redesign and upgrade. Carmel was one of Worship Times' early customers, and the company hopes to use our website as an example for other churches hoping to upgrade.

New features include "Pastor's Blog", with a welcome to the website message from Pastor Peter, a "What's Happening at Carmel" section, links to Carmel's local and area mission causes, easy ways to access the Courier, and detailed information about the Carmel Nursery School. Multiple access points are provided through a Navigation Menu Bar, and clickable photo links. Yes, there will still be a calendar. Clicking on the upper circular church photo will always bring you back to the Home Page.

We can also use your help. Carmel board members and committee chairs have already pitched in with descriptions of their programs and activities. Providing so many photographs late in the pandemic was a challenge. If you take cell phone or camera photos, shoot some at Carmel activities, including worship, and send them to Mary Kate Nolen at office@presbycarmel.org At present we can especially use photos of past Carmel Christmas events and services such as the Candlelight Choir Service, (other than past Christmas brunches which are not needed).

A Note from Transitional Pastor Peter... Join Me in the Advent of Christmas & the New Year 2022!

Dear Friends!

This is my first **Advent and Christmas** with you **In-Person**. I look forward to joining you in many of the restored, as well as some new Carmel festive traditions, as we head into the **New Year**! We will gather around the **Advent Wreath** each Sunday as families light one more candle as we prepare for Christ's coming again



pare for Christ's coming again into our life. Then, at our Christmas Eve Service, we each light a small candle and together—as they slowly **illume** the room—we experience the One for whom we have been waiting and who **is** the **Light of Life** and who brings us **Joy**.

As I think about **Advent** this year, the **Joy** so many of us experience at Christmas is the joy of receiving. And this is good—because it is often **very** difficult for us to receive. We want things or people; but it is often hard to receive them graciously. We anticipate receiving many good things at Christmas.

Yet to receive, one first has to give—or someone has to give. The **Joy** we have at Christmas comes only because first "God so loved the world that God gave..." Giving and receiving; receiving and giving: they are two sides of the same coin. **Each of us responds to the gift God has given us and we pass on the love to others.** Giving and receiving are both gifts! God has given them to us and it is up to us to be able to accept them and pass them on.

And each year it's a challenge—to **really** consider what Christmas means. Of course, we'll say we do that every year; yet take some time again this **Advent** to really ponder the meaning of the season for you and for Carmel and our future. The first participants didn't have that comfortable a season! • Imagine how comfortable an unwed pregnant teenager would be...

• Imagine a man accepting and raising an infant whose very presence is a daily reminder that he's not the father...

• Imagine shepherds sleeping outdoors being awakened by heavenly voices-sounds great, until you realize that it's

terrifying...

- Then, imagine foreign dignitaries who realize they must flee the country by another route to avoid returning to the court of a tyrannical despot...
- Oh, and Caesar's annual taxes...

This is no story about hanging Christmas ornaments on a tree or placing lights on a home. God's entry into the world was really something of a scandal and is at heart a **gift to receive and pass on.**

Session and its committees plan several special **Ad-vent and Christmas activities** and services this year—much different than our more modest pandemic Christmas last year. Inside the *Courier* you will find a number of them:

 Month-long Advent after-church drive-by celebrations, Sundays November 28 and December 5, 12 and 19 that focus on Advent themes of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love (with a mission related to each theme) as we decorate themed Christmas trees again with a 'giveaway' for attendees and info on Carmel groups to join and volunteer opportunities;

Be part of the Festival Choir and sing for **Christmas** at the Candlelight Carol Service and the Christmas Eve Service;

The Congregational Life team received such wonderful feedback for our Advent celebration last year, we decided to host a similar series this year. Beginning on Sunday November 28th, please plan to decorate the trees of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love during each week of Advent. Bring your ornaments from home or make one using the supplies stored in the box under the portico. We



so look forward to watching the beautiful scene on the front yard develop over the weeks.

In the foyer, you'll find a prayer wall and supplies you'll need to



add your prayer requests to it. We hope to pray for each other and with each other our prayers of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love will also build into a beautiful and powerful visual statement leading up to Christmas.

Last, but not least, we

would like to provide a small gift for the congregation throughout Advent. It's a hustle-bustle time of year and it's easy to neglect ourselves when we're rushing to do 'all the things.' Each Sunday after the Service, we'd love to send you home with warm soup, warm bread, warm cookies. Drive up to the kitchen door and drive home with lunch.

As it is THE most wonderful time of year, and Carmel members are wonderfully generous people, we will attach a mission component to each week. If you'd like to participate, watch the All -Church emails or Carmel's Facebook page for details.

Christmas Joy Special Offering

Advent begins November 28 and with it comes the Christmas Joy special collection. 50% supports pastors who encounter unexpected catastrophic events in their retirement that even careful planning could not



foresee. The other 50% provides scholarships and other help for students of communities of color to learn and grow in faith at Presbyterian-related schools and colleges. Many of those helped become pastors.

Special envelopes will be inserted in the orders of worship in December. Use the same method of giving but be sure to include Christmas Joy and your envelope number for directing your gift. Dedication of this collection will be December 19.

2022 Giving Envelopes

Envelopes will be available beginning in December on the tables behind the chapel. Look for them and take them home with you. For 2022 most of us will find that our numbers have been changed. We ordered fewer boxes to cut down on waste. 800 and 900 numbers will remain the same.

Per Capita

At the beginning of each year, Carmel is billed \$32 for *each confirmed member* of the church. The money is shared by General Assembly, the Synod, and Philadelphia Presbytery. This year Presbytery will support the search of our Pastoral Nominating Committee as it works as well as other help we request. —Anne Newman



Church Officers in the Class of 2023 were elected by the Congregation on November 21, 2021. In accordance with Carmel's Bylaws, our newlyelected officers will be ordained and/or installed during a morning worship service in January.

The Session expresses its heartfelt gratitude to Elders David Campbell, Kent Dyer, Anne Newman, Lynne Schutt and Dick Thomas as they complete their terms of service ministering so faithfully to our congregation as a ruling elder in the Class of 2021. Session welcomes newly elected Elders to the class of 2024 and all will begin active service following their installation in January.

The following items were among the reports and business conducted during the November Stated Meeting of the Session.

Session approved the Transitional Ministry Team recommended candidates to serve on the Pastor Nominating Committee. All were approved by the Congregation on November 21, 2021.

Session thankfully approved Christian Education's recommended leaders and volunteers for 2021-2022:

A contract with JCA Cleaning Solutions to provide the cleaning maintenance of the church and Nursery School was approved by Session. The Property Committee will be the main contact with JCA Cleaning Solutions. The Property and Personnel Committees are also forming a group of volunteers similar to Carmel's former "Merry Men" to handle the non-cleaning duties such as

room/table set ups and minor church repairs.

The Property Committee received Session's approval to contract with Critter Control to treat a squirrel infestation in the manse, especially in the ceiling of the front porch, for the sum of \$4,695. Payment to come from the manse rental fund.

Session approved the Deacons' request for the disbursement of a total of \$6,000 from the Deacons Fund through the Mission Interpretation Proposal to the following organizations – Bethanna, Caring for Friends, Dawn's Place, DePaul House, Face to Face, Gemma Services and Interfaith.




