OLD TESTAMENT READING: Proverbs 8:12-13; 22-31

I, wisdom, live with prudence, and I attain knowledge and discretion. <sup>13</sup>The fear of the LORD is hatred of evil. Pride and arrogance and the way of evil and perverted speech I hate. <sup>22</sup>The LORD created me at the beginning of His work, the first of His acts of long ago. <sup>23</sup>Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. <sup>24</sup>When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. <sup>25</sup>Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth—<sup>26</sup>when He had not yet made earth and fields, or the world's first bits of soil. <sup>27</sup>When He established the heavens, I was there, when He drew a circle on the face of the deep, <sup>28</sup>when He made firm the skies above, when He established the fountains of the deep, <sup>29</sup>when He assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress His command, when He marked out the foundations of the earth, <sup>30</sup>then I was beside Him, like a master worker; and I was daily His delight, rejoicing before Him always, <sup>31</sup>rejoicing in His inhabited world and delighting in the human race.

NEW TESTAMENT READING: John 1:10-18

<sup>10</sup>He was in the world, and the world came into being through Him; yet the world did not know Him. <sup>11</sup>He came to what was His own, and His own people did not accept Him. <sup>12</sup>But to all who received Him, who believed in His name, He gave power to become children of God, <sup>13</sup>who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. <sup>14</sup>And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen His glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. <sup>15</sup>(John testified to Him and cried out, "This was He of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because He was before me.'") <sup>16</sup>From His fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. <sup>17</sup>The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. <sup>18</sup>No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made Him known.

## WORSHIP ARTS TODAY

On the cover: James Tissot, 1836-1902. *Journey of the Magi*, from **Art in the Christian Tradition**, a project of the Vanderbilt Divinity Library, Nashville, TN.

Tissot's "Life of Our Lord Jesus Christ" project took nearly ten years to complete. When it was done, it chronicled the entire life of Jesus as recorded in the New Testament in a series of 350 watercolors. To research the project Tissot traveled to Egypt, Syria, and Palestine in 1886–87 and again in 1890. While in the Holy Land he closely observed the landscape, the vegetation, the architecture, and the manner of dress, and filled sketchbooks with what he saw. He talked with rabbis and studied Talmudic literature as well as theological and historical volumes. He believed that there was still a remaining "aura" in the places where the Gospel events took place, and he spoke of having mystical experiences that added to his careful research. What he wanted to create was something as close as possible to an eyewitness account of the life of Jesus." [from Terry Glaspey's "75 Masterpieces Every Christian Should Know"]
