OLD TESTAMENT SCRIPTURE READING: Genesis 1:1-5; 26-28

¹In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, ²the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. ³Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. ⁴And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the

darkness. ⁵ God called the light Day, and the darkness He called Night.
