Our theme for this year has been **ENGAGE**, and we are now one-quarter of the year through understanding what it means to engage one another in our faith. You may recall that our motivation behind this theme relates to all of the ways that COVID has affected our church and our "usual" way of doing things.

Our usual way involves, most importantly, in-person gatherings with as many people present as possible. I'd like to think that I would preach the same way if one person were present in our sanctuary as I would if one hundred or five hundred were present. I'd like to think that I'd be totally present and eager no matter what the crowd is. But, let's be honest: whether it's church or any other event, we get energy and enthusiasm based on how many people are present. The more people, the more exciting and invigorating the event is. Having more people present creates contagious enthusiasm, and I love looking up on a (pre-COVID) Sunday morning and seeing a great attendance of several hundred people. I feed off of your reactions when I'm preaching and teaching, and there is a palpable sense of anticipation during our crowded worship services, especially during Christmas and Easter services.

At this time last year, we were filming our worship services before an empty sanctuary, and it was pretty deflating. I remain grateful for the technology that made our services available to so many through live-streaming, and it was a vital link for all of us to remain engaged for the first three months of the pandemic. Nevertheless, worshipping in an empty sanctuary was a strange experience – one that I hope never to experience again!

The most famous metaphor for the church in the New Testament is the human body. We are the BODY of Christ: many members within one body. With a diversity of spiritual gifts, we are connected to one another in order to give witness jointly to the grace of God at work in us and our world. To have fewer and fewer of us together means to diminish our witness and our work. We can maintain the relative health of our church body and sustain this mandated separation for a limited amount of time (a year?), but eventually we will weaken. Our faith will weaken, our witness will weaken, our membership will weaken, and our whole body will weaken – unless we commit to be and remain engaged!

Our preventative medicine has been this theme of **ENGAGE** and accompanying Sunday School classes with this same theme that fall into three different units. One unit is entitled <u>Discipleship</u>, another is <u>Mission</u>, and the third is <u>Gospel</u>. Each unit is designed to provoke a reaction of deeper faith and renewed service to the world. The three ministers at GPC are teaching the different units to different groups and classes throughout this year. These classes have stirred



good discussions and thoughtful reflections regarding our cultivation of faith and how we share it with others.

I can't think of a better time for all of us to re-engage with faith and church life than right now as our society begins to emerge from the pandemic. I have been encouraged by so many people who report on their vaccination schedule. I'll get my vaccination a few weeks into April, and by the end of the month I'll be fully vaccinated and ready to be around more and more people again.

During the month of April we will celebrate Christ's resurrection and the new life we all enjoy by God's grace. Our gladness seems even more appropriate this spring as we meet in increasing numbers and as we do more faith-building activities together. We worship and learn best when we are face to face and in-person. We will be glad for the technology to connect us in the future when we're sick or homebound (or on vacation), but our strength as a church lies in being together to worship and serve.

In what new ways can you engage your heart and soul in building up your own faith and the life of our church? How can you engage your neighbor or work colleague to invite him or her to church? How will you share your faith when someone asks you why you attend church? If God's grace is the most important thing in your life, why not share it? It comes in an eternal and infinite quantity, and it was definitely meant to be shared.

Thank you for engaging in all the ways you do, and we look forward to closer contact and less "social-distancing" as we engage each other in our mutual faith and love for God through Christ.



I pray, as I'm sure you do, that the future is brighter and we can hope for/realistically dream about a time when worship and music in worship are back to normal. By the time you read this article we will be on the other side of Easter. Palm Sunday was March 28, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, April 1 and 2, and Easter Sunday, April 4. Things will not be normal music-wise, but we will worship with appropriate music for each service.

- Palm Sunday: Marcus King opened the service with *Ride On King Jesus*; Christa Navy sang *Via Dolorosa* (*Way of The Cross/Way of Sorrow* the path Jesus took to His crucifixion) as we moved from the celebration of Palm Sunday into the somber events of Holy Week.
- Wednesday, March 31, Noon: GPC provided the Community Holy Week meditation that was livestreamed each day from a different Germantown Church.
- Maundy Thursday Worship, April 1, 6:30pm: Music was provided by the Memphis String Quartet and GPC soloists the Crouse Family along with tenor T. J. Turner. Alex, of course, was at the keyboard.
- Good Friday Worship, April 2, 6:00pm offered a meditation on *The Seven Last Words of Christ* in the Chapel developed by Alex and Rev. Wiggins who led.
- EASTER Sunday Worship, April 4, 9:30 and 11:30am: GPC offered an extra morning worship to accommodate as many people as possible. Music included Karen Cooper singing I Know that my Redeemer Liveth; Coburn Jones sang The Trumpet Shall Sound. David Spencer and Ben Lewis played trumpets, and Alex played the piano, closing the service with a triumphant rendition of The Hallelujah Chorus (all pieces from Handel's MESSIAH).

- Sunday, April 11 was Youth Sunday a very special worship experience for the entire church where the youth are in charge of every aspect of the service including the special music.
- Sunday, April 18: We will feature soloist T. J. Turner, tenor.
- Sunday, April 25: Brianna Reilly, mezzo-soprano, will sing.

MAUNDY THURSDAY AND AN AGAPE MEAL

We invite you to learn about and then observe a Maundy Thursday Agape Meal and also worship with us either in-person (50 maximum) or online this Maundy Thursday, April 1, at 6:30pm.

First - what is Maundy Thursday?

The Thursday before Easter is known as either Maundy Thursday or Holy Thursday. Maundy is derived from the Latin word *mandatum*, meaning command – referring to Jesus' commandment to the disciples to "Love one another as I have loved you."

Maundy Thursday commemorates this moment, as well as the moment in time when Jesus taught what it means to be a servant as He washes the feet of His disciples and when He eats His Last Supper with His disciples.

Second - why create an Agape Meal?

Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Day are three episodes in one great celebration by which we die and rise to new life with Christ. In other words, immersion in this journey is life-shattering and life-creating, an experience of faith like no other. Here we touch the very heart of the Christian mystery.

Throughout Lent (the forty days before Good Friday) we've been walking beside Jesus as He journeys towards His suffering execution on the cross. So on this night, we can continue our journey with Jesus by creating a meal similar to the one we think He would have shared with His closest friends— His disciples.

Third – what is Agape? And what is an Agape Meal? Agape is one of the four main Greek words for love. It refers to the idealized or high-level unconditional love rather than lust, friendship, or affection (as in parental affection). It is the type of love that Jesus gives to us and expects us, His followers, to give to everyone we meet. An Agape Meal is a "love-feast" – a communal meal shared among fellow Christians.

What might the Agape Meal consist of?

The menu is simple and can be served all together or in two parts:

Cholent (slow-cooked bean stew) with unleavened bread, olives with hyssop (mint-like herb), pistachios, date charoset (chunky fruit and nut paste), honey, wine, and water.

Some Theology for Maundy Thursday and an Agape Meal: St. Thomas Aquinas viewed The Father, Christ, and the Holy Spirit as teachers and masters who provide lessons, at times by example. For Aquinas, the Last Supper and the Cross form the summit of the teaching that wisdom flows

from intrinsic grace rather than external power. For Aquinas, at the Last Supper Christ taught by example, showing the value of humility (as reflected in John's foot washing narrative) and self-sacrifice, rather than by exhibiting external, miraculous powers.

Aquinas stated that, based on John 15:15 (in the *Farewell* discourse), in which Jesus said: "No longer do I call you servants; ... but I have called you friends," those who are followers of Christ and partake in the Sacrament of the Eucharist become His friends, as those gathered at the table of the Last Supper. For Aquinas, at the Last Supper Christ made the promise to be present in the Sacrament of the Eucharist, and to be with those who partake in it, as He was with His disciples at the Last Supper.

John Calvin believed only in the two sacraments of Baptism and the "Lord's Supper" (i.e., Eucharist). Thus, his analysis of the Gospel accounts of the Last Supper was an important part of his entire theology. Calvin related the Synoptic Gospel accounts of the Last Supper with the Bread of Life Discourse in John 6:35 that states: "I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never go hungry." Calvin also believed that the acts of Jesus at the Last Supper should be followed as an example, stating that just as Jesus gave thanks to the Father before breaking the bread (1 Corinthians 11:24) those who go to the "Lord's Table" to receive the sacrament of the Eucharist must give thanks for the "boundless love of God" and celebrate the sacrament with both joy and thanksgiving.

Rising Together Roundation (RTF) promotes high academic, leadership, and character standards and broadens peer relationships among students throughout the greater community. Designed to foster academic preparedness for a group of emerging academic and social leaders, the programs and events develop and connect future leaders of our community.

Challenge 1:

Summer and After-School Programming

Students from under-resourced communities struggle to access high-quality summer and after-school programming. These students face socio-economic challenges that have brought them to this critical point in their educational development, but they are all eager to learn and thrive.

Challenge 2:

Educational Inequality

The need for educational transformation in the U.S. is real and urgent. Right now children from under-resourced communities are performing significantly below grade level.

With third-grade reading serving as a powerful predictor of lifelong success, this educational inequity is holding back generations of children from reaching their full potential. This community crisis will affect lifelong success and the economy.

Educational inequality is the greatest social justice and civil rights issue in the U.S. today. With about 200 schools and 7,000 teachers, Shelby County Schools* is among the 25 largest districts in the U.S. Of the approximately 106,000 students in the district, 80% are economically disadvantaged by free and reduced lunch standards.

Challenge 3:

Community Impact

Technology is a driving force of our economy. Well-paying degree and ever-greater levels of STEM skills. Yet studies



show the U.S. lagging behind other developed countries in creating the workforce of the future, ranking 38th out of 71 countries in math and 24th in science.

Rising Together is dedicated to serving and supporting elementary, middle, and high school students by creating, administering, and supporting excellent academic, leadership, and social programs and events and to providing necessary financial assistance so that disadvantaged students from under-served communities may participate. These programs and events are a collaborative effort by individuals representing public and independent primary and secondary schools, universities and colleges, and other organizations dedicated to excellence in education and leadership.

GPC is excited to be an ongoing partner with RTF, founded by GPC member and community leader Judd Peters. MEDICAL SUPPLY CLOSET





CIRCLES OF CARE MINISTRY

Last March the Circles of Care Ministry was launched with about 30-35 GPC members caring for about 150 GPC members aged 80+ - those who live alone and were the most vulnerable for feeling isolated and alone in the midst of the pandemic.

The Circles of Care Ministry falls underneath the umbrella of the Congregational Care Committee and Deacon Robbie Hughes is now overseeing the ministry, which is going strong. GPC members are caring for others by telephoning, texting, writing, emailing, preparing meals, delivering meals. Additionally, personal notes are being written and sent to Germantown's front-line workers, specifically our firefighters and police officers. If you know of someone who might need some tender loving care by the Circle of Care Ministry, please let Pastor Susie know at care@germantownpres.org, and likewise, if you would like to be involved in this vital ministry as a caring soul.

The Circles of Care Ministry launched on March 20, 2020 and continues to reach out and connect with many GPC parishioners - most especially our beloved seniors. Through all the ways we are connecting with people, we realize that there is a need to expand the care to younger parishioners and so we are wanting to expand the ministry. The way we will do this is to assign those who are interested in participating 5-10 members that you are willing to connect with each month: either call, email, or write personal notes to - but commit to contacting each one once a month at least. If you are willing to join our ministry team, just let Pastor Susie know by emailing her at care@ germantownpres.org and she will give you a group of people to connect with and their contact information. The relationships being formed are wonderful!

VBS Volunteer Opportunities

Vacation Bible School June 7-11, 2021 WELCOME BACK VOLUNTEERS!

If you ask any of our confirmands what has been their favorite church experience, they will most likely answer...VBS! We are so excited to welcome children back into the church this year for a fun week to learn about Jesus Christ! We will take a closer look at the Bible as we learn to FOCUS on Jesus!

We cannot have a safe and successful VBS without our dedicated volunteers! Please review the positions in which we are in need. You may sign up to volunteer by going to www.germantownpres.org/vbs or email Anna at annaw@germantownpres.org.

SHEPHERD – The Shepherd leads a group of 5 or 6 children around the church to each rotation. At each rotation a lead teacher will meet you there to lead the designated activity. Your job is simply to know the children in your group, lead them to each rotation, and be hands on as they need encouragement and help. You will have a youth mentor assigned to your group, and he / she will be reliable help! You may sign up to be an Shepherd as your schedule allows...5 days a week or 1 day a week. We understand Shepherds need some flexibility during his / her week, and we aim to make it work! Arrival time is 8:30am for the morning meeting. Head home after all of your children are picked up by a parent – 12:15pm. Approximately 10 shepherds needed each day!

ELEMENTARY or PRESCHOOL CLASSROOM TEACHER – Calling all teachers! We need people who can deliver a clear message with interactive fun for the children. The elementary classroom teacher's role is to teach the Bible story of the day. A daily video is included in this time frame. Activities and supplies will be ready and prepared for you. You will receive a notebook so that you can study over the lesson, but activities and supplies will be ready and prepped! Arrive to GPC and head straight to your classroom at 9:00. Your first class will arrive at 9:15 with a Shepherd and youth mentor to help in the classroom. We need 4 classroom teachers! It is most helpful in this position if you can be present to teach all week, Monday through Friday.

SNACK and KITCHEN MANAGERS - We have a preplanned snack menu. We will need a volunteer to purchase the snacks and organize the kitchen so that the snack can be prepped daily. Daily, we will need 2 volunteers to prepare the snack and deliver it to individual children at the snack station. These 2 volunteers will also need to prepare the adult volunteer food snack station and clean it up daily.

Our financial performance continues to improve over prior years despite the pandemic. Included in our figures for February is the first required payment on our construction loan for the Education Building and Fellowship Hall that was completed in August 2019. The current balance on that loan is \$1,483,474 and will be repaid based on a 15-year amortization. Interest rates remain low and our rate on the loan is 2.22%.
