ear Church Family and Friends,

I hope that this month of July finds you healthy and well. It's hard for me to believe we're half-way through 2021 already. For me, time stood still last year during the pandemic, but now it seems to be moving at a pretty good clip as we emerge from the COVID-induced restrictions.

We had friends over for dinner recently, all of whom go to different churches, and the conversation topic was: what have we learned from this, and what will be different moving forward for our churches?

My answer was/is: I think we have better opportunities ahead of us to tell the good news of the Gospel than we have ever realized. I think we will initially see a surge of people attending church in person again because they are so grateful to be back in our house of worship. Then, as the fall comes, we will settle into a pattern of seeing fewer in-person worshippers as people travel again, attend college football games, visit grandparents, and resume our normal lives. Nevertheless, people will realize how unpredictable and fragile life is and how much we need God.

What has changed so much over the last year is our ability to reach people online. We currently see a map of locations from which people join our worship service, and it ranges all the way from the northeast to the northwest. I expect that people who grew up at GPC, or who were once members who have moved away, long for our worship service and a place they loved to call home. Rather than visit a local congregation, they plug into our services long-distance. Plus our own members, who would not have watched church while on vacation, are tuning in on Sundays and inviting others to join them during this hour on Sunday morning that is special to them. I believe that our live-streaming, online ministry will only grow over the next several years.

I have also learned through this pandemic how much people love God through their church. I am moved to tears each week when people come back to church for the first time since March of 2020. People long to be in the house of the Lord, and there is such a feeling of relief and joy when they come back to worship in-person (and this is in the AC — just wait until we get back in the sanctuary!).

This has been such an unusual season for us and for the history of our church. I still do not believe that what we have faced was more difficult than what previous generations faced in 1941-1944, or in the 1870's (the Yellow Fever epidemic), or 1861-1865. The previous members of our church, over the long haul of GPC's life, have faced much harder circumstances than those we've faced over the last fifteen months. And yet....this has been a hard season for us, and we are ssssooooo ready for this forced-separation to be over.



In regard to our February flood, we are grateful to several church members for their tireless efforts in working with our contractor to fix the sanctuary and our children's education wing. And while we have missed being in our sanctuary, we are grateful that timing of this accident happened while we were already in limited capacity because of COVID. We took advantage of the situation to make some improvements to the sanctuary that we would not have if not for the flood.

Even during the pandemic, we have been forward-looking as a church, especially among our deacons and elders. As many of you know, a Strategic Visioning Committee has been working for many months to assess, discern, and improve our goals as a congregation. This process has been underway since the fall of 2019, but when the pandemic hit, all of our strategic visioning work was placed on hold. We are grateful that the process was resumed in the fall of 2020 under the leadership of Kirsten King, our seminary intern, who also happens to to be a former project manager at FedEx. Our deacons and elders met together on Saturday morning June 19 to hear the final report from the Strategic Visioning Committee. In the near future, you will hear much more about our four main goals that will guide our planning, work, and life together as a church for the remainder of this year and well into next. You will hear much more about these goals and the rationale behind them in the coming weeks and months: Connecting, Evangelism, Partnerships, and Communications.

Finally, for this month, in regard to your church staff, you will see in this newsletter our fond farewell to Debbi Schweizer, who has served in our financial office the last three years. We are grateful for her, as Debbi has worked hard with Fred Turverey to ensure that our financial records are perfect. We welcome her replacement Amber Miller, who will work with Fred Turverey in all of our financial record-keeping.

As a congregation, we say a heartfelt thank-you and fare-well also to Anna White, who has served the children and families of our church so faithfully for almost six years. Anna has done an outstanding job in leading our call for faith formation in children and their families. Anna grew up at GPC, and as her family relocates to Brentwood, TN, at the end of July, we offer our deep gratitude to God for all of her service to GPC.

May God bless you and those whom you love in this month of July!


Amber has a B.A. in History from the University of Memphis; she is a self proclaimed career student; and she is currently pursing a degree in Accounting.

When I began my Master of Divinity studies at Columbia Theological Seminary in Georgia, I never imagined that I would finish my final year right back here at home in Tennessee. While the pandemic drove all the coursework online, I still needed to complete a year of supervised ministry in a church setting. I was not sure how I was going to accomplish this. Who would mentor and supervise a pastoral intern during this challenging time? Yet through the leading of the Holy Spirit, it came to me one morning with great clarity, "I have to call Pastor Susie!" With much support and encouragement, Pastor Susie and Pastor Will welcomed me into partnership in ministry.

Seminarians were encouraged to enter into our internships using the practice of PULSE: Pay attention, Understand empathetically, Love with connection, Sense the sacredness, Embody new life. For the past nine months I have had the opportunity to practice those skills and participate in all aspects of our life together as a family of faith. My experiences were diverse, rich, faith-shaping opportunities. I engaged with the staff, sometimes as a leader and sometimes shadowing others as they led. I was exposed to everything from payroll to preaching, prayer to pastoral care, baptisms to building maintenance, caregiving to communion planning, session and diaconate meetings to special needs ministry, floods, funerals, fellowship, family life ministries, and music with masks and worship with wonder. Despite the constraints of social distancing, I got to know many members and to share in the great affection of this congregation and staff. I had the privilege of working closely with the pastors and the Strategic Visioning Committee as the capstone project for my degree. We emerged with a fresh articulation of the strategic goals and calling for the life of this church in this time.

While my time of supervised ministry has officially ended, my learning and friendships continue. Your steadfast faith as a congregation has prepared me for my continued journey. With your gift to me of beautiful preaching stoles and a watercolor print of the beloved GPC chapel, I carry those reminders of this experience with me on each prayerful step I next take. Thank you. Thank you. I will spend the upcoming fall months working as a hospital chaplain at Grady Hospital in Atlanta, GA and preparing for ordination exams, but I plan to visit from time to time.

I am thankful for your partnership in sharing the Word of God and the love of God. I am thankful for your faith in our Lord Jesus Christ and how you reflect that in our community. I am thankful for your affection, support, and willingness to let me share in your spiritual gifts and discover my own.



Grace was born and raised in the Memphis area. She graduated from Arlington High School in 2019 with a special education diploma and Best Buddy Award. She enjoys friendly interactions with peers and wore a big smile at both the Memphis Joy Promade and the Friendship Circle Picnic! (See photos) In fact, since she began Friendship Circle in August 2020, Grace has become quite popular, and her friends cheer their greetings to her when she arrives. Grace

says she enjoys how "everyone is so nice," and that she "likes the crafts" we do. She particularly enjoys painting! Grace engages in many churches' special needs programs, including Macky and Friends, Young Life Capernaum, and JoyLife901. Previously, she attended Lucy and Company Dance program, where she initially met many of the friends she continues to see in these other programs. What Grace most enjoys is seeing and being around other people, and especially "hanging out with the other girls."

Grace has many interests, such as listening to music, watching cooking videos and helping in the kitchen, swimming, and riding a three-wheel bike. Her favorite genres of music are country, soft jazz and some "old 80's," too. Grace's whole family likes Mexican food best, and Grace shared she enjoys popcorn. Her family owns a crank-style stove popper that Grace says makes the best popcorn! The family hopes they can get their own swimming pool put in next year, so Grace can enjoy swimming more frequently. # SPECIAL NEEDS MINISTRY

### PARENTS SHARE THEIR PAIN-FUL STORY AS A POOL SAFETY REMINDER

Harrison Chase Chaney, born May 29, 2011, died three years later, when he drowned while swimming. Harry was born on the autism spectrum.

Six months after the tragedy of their son's death, Harry's parents learned of a study which found the number one cause of death in children with autism is drowning. In 2009, 2010, and 2011, accidental drowning accounted for 91% of the total U.S. deaths reported in children with an ASD ages 14 and younger.

Though Harry's parents' devastation cannot be mitigated, they continue to inform other families of this correlation in hopes that fewer will suffer such a loss. They shared that despite working with many autism specialists, these statistics never came to their attention so they could have made different decisions about pool and water safety. Harry's parents urge people to share this information with parents of children with an ASD simply so they might have the chance to be better informed than Harry's parents were when they lost their little boy.

This announcement serves as a reminder of being safe around pools during these warm summer months. Harry's parents also urge all parents to cherish their moments with their children and enjoy their recreational time, because you cannot get it back once it's passed.



Rising Together Foundation (RTF) promotes high academic, leadership, and character standards and broadens peer relationships among students throughout the greater community. Designed to foster academic preparedness for a group of emerging academic and social leaders, the programs and events develop and connect future leaders of our community.

#### Challenge 1:

Summer and After-School Programming

Students from under-resourced communities struggle to access high-quality summer and after-school programming. These students face socio-economic challenges that have brought them to this critical point in their educational development, but they are all eager to learn and thrive.

#### Challenge 2:

Educational Inequality

The need for educational transformation in the U.S. is real and urgent. Right now children from under-resourced communities are performing significantly below grade level.

With third-grade reading serving as a powerful predictor of lifelong success, this educational inequity is holding back generations of children from reaching their full potential. This community crisis will affect lifelong success and the economy.

Educational inequality is the greatest social justice and civil rights issue in the U.S. today. With about 200 schools and 7,000 teachers, Shelby County Schools\* is among the 25 largest districts in the U.S. Of the approximately 106,000 students in the district, 80% are economically disadvantaged by free and reduced lunch standards.

#### Challenge 3: Community Impact

Technology is a driving force of our economy. Well-paying jobs often require a college els of STEM skills. Yet stud-



ies show the U.S. lagging behind other developed countries in creating the workforce of the future, ranking 38th out of 71 countries in math and 24th in science.

Rising Together is dedicated to serving and supporting elementary, middle, and high school students by creating, administering, and supporting excellent academic, leadership, and social programs and events and to providing necessary financial assistance so that disadvantaged students from under-served communities may participate. These programs and events are a collaborative effort by individuals representing public and independent primary and secondary schools, universities and colleges, and other organizations dedicated to excellence in education and leadership.

GPC is excited to be an ongoing partner with RTF, founded by GPC member and community leader Judd Peters.
