







Jesus invites people to follow Him with two approaches to discipleship. One way is immediate: a quick decision of complete trust to follow Jesus no matter what. We see Jesus invite people to follow Him, and He does not appear to give them much time to deliberate. He called His first disciples by the Sea of Galilee, and all He said to them was: "Follow me." He offered no explanation of the benefits or a three-point rationale on why following Him was best. This happens on many occasions, and people stop what they are doing and follow Him.

The other way is slower and more deliberate. Some people have to scratch their head and search their heart before going all in. Nicodemus is one such person. He shows up at the beginning of John's gospel; he meets Jesus one night; and his heart is full of questions. He has listened to Jesus' teachings, and he knows that Jesus has a unique insight into God's will. He appears to leave Jesus in John 3 still confused and unsure. By the end of John's gospel, however, Nicodemus is a follower of Jesus. He takes the body of Jesus after the crucifixion and prepares it for burial. We don't know what happened in between that first meeting with Jesus and the last, but he became a believer and a follower.

The Apostle Paul's conversion also takes more time than we realize. He hated Christians and hounded them in order to crush the followers of Jesus. He had a dramatic encounter with Jesus on the road to Damascus, and he was struck blind as he fell to the ground in the presence of the glory of Christ. He was led by the hand into the city, and he sat in darkness for three days before a man named Ananias was sent by God to lead him into faith. Ananias meets with Paul and oversees his baptism into faith.

Jesus tells people to be strategic and deliberate in their thinking when it comes to faith and following Him. One time, He makes an analogy between following Him in faith and building a building. "If you want to build a tower," says Jesus, "you first have to assess the cost and make sure you can complete it." Jesus also invites potential followers to imagine a king who wants to go to battle against another army. The king must analyze his forces and know his weaknesses, or else he will lose. Being strategic, deliberate, and forward-thinking is not opposed to faith.

GPC has always manifested both approaches toward faith and following Jesus. We celebrate those who follow eagerly and devote their whole being to Jesus. We also appreciate, however, those for whom faith and following require deliberation and discernment. As a congregation, we strive to use foresight and to be strategic in our actions as a body of Christ.

After many discussions, prayers, and deliberations, we have updated our Vision Plan for Ministry that will guide us for the next several years. You will see and hear more about this in the upcoming weeks, but I wanted to share them with you now in advance of unveiling them in a sermon series in November. Our visionary priorities are:

<u>Connecting</u>: Teach, guide, and support people through stages of faith formation, transitions, and seasons of life. Identify and use spiritual gifts, implement innovative Christian education, and emphasize intergenerational ministry to foster a sense of belonging.

Growing: Reveal the life-changing love of Jesus Christ to others by witnessing to the good news of God's transforming grace to enable growth in the body of Christ. Journey, through authentic relationships, with spiritual seekers and those looking for a church home to explore spiritual needs and questions that encourage drawing closer to God.

<u>Caring</u>: Work as community partners in local and global settings, emulating the example of Christ, to seek justice for the poor, the disadvantaged, and the oppressed. Offer resources, time, and talents to promote the good, economic well-being, and fair treatment of people.

<u>Sharing</u>: Utilize the most effective communication techniques, both internal and external, to share the work of Christ's church. Drive awareness to engage and promote involvement.

Each Session and Diaconate Committee has crafted goals for this year based on these priorities. Each committee looked at its current work and then envisioned where it might expand and grow with these four priorities in mind. You will hear more about these vision priorities in the weeks ahead, and I hope you will find your place of worship and service within the life of our church.




WELCOME, REV. JAMES AWUNI

Rev. James K. Awuni is the Chairperson of the Upper Presbytery, Presbyterian Church of Ghana. He is the former pastor of the Presbyterian Church of Bolgatanga, the Bolgatanga District Minister, and the Director of Finance of the Upper Presbytery.

GPC's partnership with the Presbyterian Church of Ghana began in the summer of 2017, when we sent an exploratory team to determine how we might best partner with the PCG. In 2018, the Rev. Emmanuel Atami, then Chairperson of the presbytery, came to GPC, and while with us, taught us so much about how they do evangelism. In 2019, we returned to the Upper Presbytery and learned even more about their mission outreach, and the areas where we could partner with them. In 2019, Rev. Awuni came to GPC for World Communion Sunday, Throughout 2020-21, the Ghana Mission Team (Lance Warren, Beth Brock, Erin Bowden, Ty Hardin, Molly Miller, and Pastor Susie Wiggins) have continued to meet (even during the COVID global pandemic via Zoom) and, with the support of the whole GPC congregation, have continued to work closely with the Upper Presbytery. We are thrilled to have Pastor James back with us as our guest preacher for the 2021 World Communion Sunday.

WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY, OCTOBER 3

"All who eat and drink without discerning the body, eat and drink judgment against themselves." (I Cor. 11:29)

The first Sunday in October is designated as World Communion Sunday, which celebrates our oneness in Christ with all our brothers and sisters around the world. Paul tells us that we are to "discern the body" when we partake of Holy Communion, mindful that we note our relationship to all our brothers and sisters in Christ in the celebration....

A Presbyterian Gift

World Communion Sunday (originally called World Wide Communion Sunday) is a gift of the Presbyterian Church to the larger ecumenical church. The first celebration occurred at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA, in 1933 where Dr. Hugh Thompson Kerr served as pastor.

John A. Dalles, a PCUSA pastor who has researched the history of World Communion Sunday notes this in his blog entry, reprinted from the October 7, 2002, issue of Presbyterian Outlook:

Davitt S. Bell (the late Clerk of Session and church historian at Shadyside) recalled that Dr. Kerr first conceived the notion of World Communion Sunday during his year as moderator of the General Assembly (1930). Dr. Kerr's younger son, the Rev. Dr. Donald Craig Kerr, who is pastor emeritus of the Roland Park Presbyterian Church in Baltimore, was sixteen in 1933. He has related that World Communion Sunday grew out of the Division of Stewardship at Shadyside. It was their attempt to bring churches together in a service of Christian unity—in which everyone might receive both inspiration and information, and above all, to know how important the Church of Jesus Christ is, and how each congregation is interconnected one with another. When I asked Donald Kerr how the idea of World Communion Sunday spread from that first service to the world wide practice of today, this is what he replied,

"The concept spread very slowly at the start. People did not give it a whole lot of thought. It was during the Second World War that the spirit caught hold, because we were trying to hold the world together. World Wide Communion symbolized the effort to hold things together, in a spiritual sense. It emphasized that we are one in the Spirit and the Gospel of Jesus Christ."

Celebration of World Wide Communion Sunday was adopted as a denominational practice in the Presbyterian Church (US) in 1936. Churches in other denominations were invited to celebrate with us from the beginning, but it wasn't until 1940 when the Department of Evangelism of the Federal Council of Churches (a predecessor body of

the National Council of Churches) promoted extending the celebration to a number of churches around the world that the practice became widespread. Today, World Communion Sunday is celebrated around the world, demonstrating that the church founded on Jesus Christ peacefully shares God-given goods in a world increasingly destabilized by globalization and global market economies based on greed.

Presbyterian Women Are Cooking





MEET MY FRIEND, CHRIS MITCHELL





Each Sunday or Monday, flowers from the chancel will be placed into portable sized vases to take to the sick, bereaved, or shut in.



This is a great way for us to get renewal and strength.




How To Dedicate a Sunday Worship Flower Arrangement

The Session met on Thursday, September 17, and agreed to leave in place our current guidelines regarding our communal life at this stage of the pandemic (with a minor exception regarding choir/singers). For the next four weeks, the Session strongly recommends that everyone wear a mask while indoors. We believe this is a demonstration of self-sacrificial love for those who cannot be vaccinated for reasons of age (children under 12) or health. Everyone working with children under twelve (i.e. Sunday School teachers, nursery workers, etc.) shall wear a mask. We will continue to rely on expert medical advice as we discuss and discern what is best for our congregation, and we encourage everyone to do the same for themselves and their families. Groups where children are not involved may self-regulate their meeting space and procedures, subject to the above statements. The Director of Music has been given permission to explore how more singers may take part in the choir loft, provided they sing while wearing masks, and a soloist may remove his or her mask to sing if he or she is appropriately spaced from the congregation and other singers.

We had a deficit of \$29,019 in August, which is typical for this time of the year. The good news is that with 67% of our year complete, our year-to-date income is about 73% of our annual budget and year-to-date operating expenses are 60% of the annual budget. Our year-to-date surplus is more than double that of 2020 and is the strongest since at least 2015. This is the result of good expense control on the part of our staff and faithful stewardship on the part of our members. COVID restrictions are still having an impact on some of our programs, and we can anticipate an increase in our expenses as we emerge from the pandemic.
